## A scenario for Lasalle 2 by Honour Games:

## The fight for Markkleeberg, am 16 October 1813

## Description

It is the first day of the battle of Leipzig. Schwarzenberg's Coalition army confronts Napoleon's Grand Army south of the city. This game covers the first assault in the West by Kleist's Corps on the Franco-Polish forces at Markkleeberg.

## Objectives and Victory

Two objectives are shown on the map: one in the town of Markkleeberg in B1 and the other on the Hill in square A4. Both are worth 1VP.
The game length is 8 turns.
There is no sudden death in this scenario. The Allied objective is to dislodge the enemy from their positions: victory is only possible by capturing victory points.
Baggage: Franco-Poles: Row A. Allies: Row D.
Table size: 24BW x 36BW ( $4^{\prime} \times 6$ ' at 1 BW $=2$ ')

Stream thin blue
Only the stream is fordable. The Pleisse river is impassable.

Notes.
The 14th Polish Cuirassiers begin with a strength of 4 because the unit was only two squadrons strong. The Cuirassiers may not form line.

The 14th Russian Division, along with the rest of the Russian troops in Schwarzenbeg's army, was seriously understrength. Each regiment is represented by only one infantry unit.

The 14th Division was strengthened with two Prussian batteries for its assault on 16 October.
There are different versions of the order of battle of VIII Corps in 1813, partly because it was frequently reorganised over the summer and it never actually reached its theoretical structure. I have used the OOB in Mariusz Łukasiewicz's 'Armia Księcia Józefa, 1813' as this draws on first hand Polish documents.

The scenario order of battle omits those Franco-Polish and Austrian units that fought each other across the river Pleisse, as, apart from tying down French and Polish troops, their combat did not affect the fighting on the east bank (the Austrian attack was hampered by the marshy wooded terrain to the West of the Pleisse).
